#### Seminar (6. September 2012)

The seminar will introduce European possibilities for documentary film coproductions, European documentary film market and approach of renowned TV broadcasters towards coproductions with independent producers. It is designed for up and coming producers and documentary filmmakers from Slovakia and neighbouring countries.

#### **EUROPEAN DOCUMENTARY NETWORK (EDN)**

EDN je is a membership organization with more than 1000 members from more than 60 countries. It arranges a range of pitching sessions and networking events to stimulate exchange beyond national borders and between more established documentary producers and emerging talents. Each one of these sessions is a good opportunity to meet commissioning editors – producers get an opportunity to create real partnerships which can result in future deals and coproductions.

#### MITTELDEUTSCHER RUNDFUNK (MDR)

Mitteldeutscher Rundfunk (MDR) is part of the ARD-network located in Leipzig / Sachsen. It offers a wide variety of TV for all viewers in its region, the middle of Germany. The range extends from regular news and sports broadcasts to entertainment shows, political magazines, cultural broadcasts, feature films, historical documentaries, religious and musical broadcasts. It offers a 24-hour programme and reaches a market share of nearly 10 percent of the audience. MDR also contributes to the nation-wide public broadcast channel ARD – in all genres of programming. Documentaries hold a strong position here: all in all, 50 hours are being produced p.a. for ARD, MDR and ARTE. Emphasis is on the history of World War II, the Cold War and the history of the former German Democratic Republic. A new trend here, however, is looking at the medieval and pre-medieval ages, archaeological and mythical traces. A strong emphasis is also put on projects that look towards the Eastern European countries, their history, people and culture. MDR Television needs two weekly documentary slots to be served, and here the programme philosophy is the same as for the ARD slots. MDR does in-house productions, international co-productions and programme licensing.

#### **ASSOCIATE DIRECTORS**

Associate Directors is an independent production company based in Belgium, with offices in Antwerp and Brussels. Associate Directors focuses on (co)-producing creative documentaries for an international audience. The productions concentrate on social relevant issues and cultural in-depth stories. Started in 1991, today the company combines the filmmaking experience of Mark Daems, Jan Lapeire and Bram Crols. Associate Directors brings together established and new talent on the cure for innovative ideas. Through the film making process, Associate Directors established good intense working relations with many funding bodies, public and commercial broadcasters, and distribution opportunities among others. Associate Directors is an active member of European Documentary Network (EDN). Producer Mark Daems is the EDN national contact person
