The last film of a trilogy directed by Jan Svěrák and written by Zdeněk Svěrák. The trilogy began with The Elementary School, exploring childhood, continued into adulthood with Academy-award winning Kolya, and now comes to completion with this comic love story about men facing old age. Teacher Josef Tkaloun, who is past retirement age, realises one day that he no longer understands his pupils, and so he quits. But then he finds himself isolated in his flat with only his wife for company. Unsure of how to deal with this new situation, Josef tries to find a way out. After a few attempts at finding a decent job he accepts a position at a refundable bottles counter in the local supermarket. In this seemingly inhospitable place, he solves what had been the root of his unhappiness. At the centre of a city community, Josef finally finds his way back to his own wife.

Mirrored in the fate of a young Czech waiter's life are the hopes, conflicts, dramas, and defeats of Czechoslovak history in the last century. Based on that book, director Jiří Menzel presents a film about a man in the twilight of his life seeking images of the era he has lived through. About a man who yearned to fill his life with wealth and beauty no matter what the circumstances, a man whose luck always lay in his encountering some misfortune.

CITIZEN HAVEL (CITOYEN HAVEL) directed by Miroslav Janek & Pavel Koutecký

After the split of Czechoslovakia in 1992, former political dissident, leader of the Velvet Revolution and playwright Václav Havel became the first president of a new country, the Czech Republic. Thus it came to pass, that a former enemy of the state was actually given the popular mandate to transform that state and its institutions. Such events are not commonplace so, from day one, he permitted his friend, filmmaker Pavel Koutecký, to capture as much of it as possible, whether in the Prague Castle or around the world. The result is Citizen Havel, a feature-length documentary of never-before-seen footage that provides an intimate look at a man thrust into the spotlight of international politics and celebrity, trying to maintain a balance between public and personal life while bringing his nation out of its communist past and into a democratic future.

4 SLOVAK FILMS

Slovak cinema is represented by Bathory, directed by the famous Slovak director Juraj Jakubisko, succeeded in breaking long-standing box office records in Slovak Republic and moreover, as a coproduction between Slovak Republic, Czech Republic and Hungary (and also the UK), it is a good example of co-operation among the Visegrad countries. Thanks to the films of young directors Juraj Lehotský (Blind Loves) and Peter Kerekes (Cooking History) that have been travelling the festival circuit across the world, winning numerous international awards and even finding their way into international distribution, Slovak film has made itself known far beyond the country's borders. As for children's films, a genre with a long tradition in the history of Slovak cinematography despite a recent significant decline in production, Thomas the Falconer has been the natural choice I firmly believe that in the future, we will be able to showcase further successes and quality films in the company of our close Visegrad partners.

The gruesome tale of Countess Elizabeth Bathory, notorious yet obscure, has been recounted by historians, writers, poets, playwrights, musicians, painters, and moviemakers. Tradition has it that Countess Bathory was the greatest murderess in the history of humankind, as documented by her entry in the Guinness Book of Records. She tortured her victims, exclusively women, before killing them. She bathed in their blood, and tore the flesh from their bodies with her teeth while they were still alive. But is that really true? In four centuries, no historical document has been found to reveal what had exactly happened. The plot of this film diametrically opposes the established legend.

It's the spring of 1981. In a little seaside town, four 18-year-olds form their own punkrock band. Their lead singer is Janek, a sensitive poetic-type. In the meantime the Solidarity movement initiates a massive wave of workers' protests, which sweeps throughout Poland. Janek starts dating Basia, much to the disapproval of her union-leader father who doesn't like his daughter befriending the son of an officer. On December 13, 1981, the day that martial law is imposed, the political situation clashes with boys' lives. Janek tries to express his experiences of love, friendship and unfair judgment, through his music and lyrics. He's forced into adulthood almost overnight.

One day a one-eyed person introducing himself as the Cyclops gives him an offer: if Malkáv kills an unknown person, he, the Cyclops will provide the money for the Swedish hospital. For more than a century, the nationality of one village in Central Europe has changed in a season-like cadenza: first it belonged to the Habsburg Empire, then to Czechoslovakia, next to Hungary, then to the Soviet Union. At the end of WW II, the Russians established a border that divided the village of Szelmenc over two separate countries. Families on one side live in Slovak Republic, which is now a member of EU. On the other side, their relatives suffer from the unstable political and economic circumstances in Ukraine. The film starts with the trip that the mayors of Little Szelmenc and Great Szelmenc made to Washington in 2004, where they urged the necessity of constructing a border-crossing at the congressional Human Rights Caucus. Two years later, it was built – but who is actually benefiting from it?

They learn about the fate of their kinscats from a busy bee journalist mouse called Stanley who is captured by blood-mice and hunter cats at the end of his successful expedition to find Livingstone in the jungle. The jungle cats evoke the first deputy chief of hell, Moloch and they set out with him to put the world back to order. Whether they succeed in this or not remains unanswered until one watches CATcher –Cat City 2.
